

I have been thinking a lot about Isaiah 9:5 where he says, "the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire". This is one of three great word pictures of peace that Isaiah offers to describe the impact of the coming Messiah. The first one is Isaiah 2:4; "they shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation; neither shall they learn war anymore". Both are military images that denote the transformation of things meant for destruction into elements for provision. Weapons of war turned into tools of agriculture, and bloodied uniforms, items of destruction, used for production.

Perhaps it is because we are beginning the new year with so much evidence of war and hatred. Almost daily, we see the images of buildings in rubble, families torn apart, and innocent people injured or killed. Or maybe it is because we are still in the Christmas season, and I am reminded that the first response to the news of the Messiah's birth by the political power was the attack of innocent people. As Herod, feeling his throne threatened, spills innocent blood to try and protect his own personal kingdom. That is the way of the powerful, to attack, to take, and to overthrow.

The ultimate image of peace in Isaiah is in Chapter 11, where he describes the Peaceful kingdom. It is an image of all creation living in unity without violence. It shows that all of creation is indeed connected and meant to live in unity and harmony. Sharing resources instead of hoarding them or fighting over them. It also tells us the way to attain this unity is not through political powers or earthly rulers, but only when we allow God to take the throne and allow divine will to overcome our division. My prayer for the coming year is that all of creation, from Kentucky to Kyiv, may finally know the peace that God intends.
